

Preface

The EASS (East Asian Social Survey) project is pleased to publish codebook for the sixth module of the EASS. The EASS project was launched June 2003 at the JGSS International Symposium 2003, and lead by four teams, Japan, Korea, China, and Taiwan. One of the most important methodological features of the EASS project is that the modules are incorporated into a pre-existing survey framework in each society, rather than creating a new independent cross-national survey. Modeled after the General Social Survey (GSS) in the United States, the four teams conduct GSS-type nationally representative sample surveys annually or biannually. Japanese General Social Survey (JGSS) began in 2000, and is conducted by the JGSS Research Center, Osaka University of Commerce. Taiwan Social Change Survey (TSCS) was established in 1984 by the Institute of Sociology, Academia Sinica. Korean General Social Survey (KGSS) conducted by the Survey Research Center, Sungkyunkwan University and Chinese General Social Survey (CGSS) conducted by the National Survey Research Center, Renmin University of China and the Institute for Empirical Social Science Research, Xi'an Jiaotong University, both began in 2003.

The theme for the first EASS, the EASS 2006 was Family, the EASS 2008 was Culture and Globalization, the EASS 2010 was Health and Society, the EASS 2012 was Network Social Capital, and the EASS 2015 was Work Life in East Asia. The sixth module was Families in East Asia, which is the same topic as the first module of the EASS 2006. The four teams created the EASS 2016 Family module in order to compare with the EASS 2006, with the aim to capture the current family situations in Japan, Korea, China and Taiwan as well as to understand the family changes over the past 10 years.

The theme of the EASS2016 module was decided in July 2014, and the details of the module was confirmed in May 2016 after a number of discussions. The Secretariat for the EASS project between 2014 and 2015 was Professor CHANG, Chin-fen at the Institute of Sociology, Academia Sinica, and the between 2016 and 2017 was Professor KIM, Jibum who is a Director of Survey Research Center at Sungkyunkwan University. Professor Kim was also the Chair of the EASS 2016 module.

In the EASS 2016 Family Module, there are 8 items that was dropped from the 2006 module, and 2 items are newly added. Topics included in the 2016 module are: living arrangements (patterns of residence and living apart temporary) family interactions and support, family values (e.g. gender role division, marriage, divorce, father's authority) first time meeting with the spouse, parental influence on marriage, parental support after marriage, spousal relationship, decision-making between couples, household chores, and family activity.

Korean and Taiwanese teams conducted the survey in 2016 while the Chinese team conducted it in 2017. Japanese team was unable to conduct the survey in 2016, but JGSS received funding from Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in April 2016 to conduct the survey. JGSS-2017 survey that includes the EASS 2016 Family module was successfully conducted in 2017. Valid responses for the JGSS-2017 was 744, which was fairly small compared to 2,130 cases in 2006. In order to expand the sample size, JGSS conduced another survey with almost the same questionnaire, JGSS-2018. By combining JGSS-2017 and JGSS-2018, the number of valid responses is 2,660.

KGSS started the integration and harmonization of the 2016 data file, and JGSS which was working on corrections of past data files (EASS 2006, EASS 2012, and EASS 2015) took over and completed the harmonization. EASS 2016 was deposited to ICPSR and EASSDA.

The EASS project would like to acknowledge the work of Professor CHANG, Chin-fen (secretariat for the EASS project between 2014 and 2015) and Professor KIM, Jibum (secretariat between 2016 and 2017 and the Chair of the 2016 module) for their leadership. The EASS would also like to express its deep appreciations to all members of the four teams and other people who contributed to the module as well as to all those who kindly participated to the surveys.

Data users are strongly asked to report any forms of works using EASS 2016 (e.g., journal articles, book chapters, conference papers, etc.) to the JGSS Research Center (jgss@daishodai.ac.jp) and they are also asked to cite the following acknowledgement statement:

"East Asian Social Survey (EASS) 2016 is based on Chinese General Social Survey (CGSS), Japanese General Social Surveys (JGSS), Korean General Social Survey (KGSS) and Taiwan Social Change Survey (TSCS), and integrated by the JGSS Research Center."

The JGSS is certainly responsible in due courses for the mistakes and corrections, if any, on any part of the codebooks and datasets and would more than welcome comments and/or questions from the

An Introduction to the EASS/EASSDA

The EASS (East Asian Social Survey) is a biennial social survey project that purports to produce and disseminate academic survey data sets in East Asia. As a cross-national network of the four GSS-type surveys in East Asia--CGSS (Chinese General Social Survey), JGSS (Japanese General Social Survey), KGSS (Korean General Social Survey), and TSCS (Taiwan Social Change Survey)--EASS is dedicated to the promotion of comparative studies on diverse aspects of social lives in East Asia. Launched in 2003, EASS is one of the few internationally coordinated social survey data collection efforts, and is truly unique in its East Asian focus.

At the 2008 General Meeting in Tokyo, Japan, an agreement has been reached to establish and locate the EASSDA (East Asian Social Survey Data Archive), EASS's central data archive, in the Academy of East Asian Studies in the Sungkyunkwan University, Seoul, Korea. The mission of EASSDA is to integrate, harmonize, and archive data and documentations of EASS module surveys so as to distribute and disseminate them to the social science community all over the world.

The objective of EASSDA is to provide students and scholars in social science community with an integrated EASS data sets collected by coordinated efforts of the participating institutions in the four countries. In doing so, EASSDA endeavors eventually to enable and promote as much comparative studies as possible on diverse topics and issues unique to the East Asian society.
