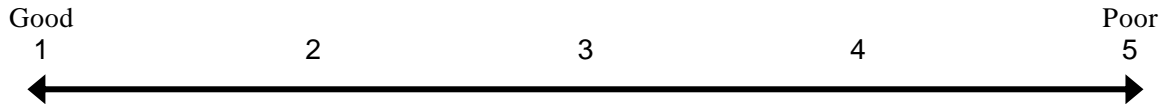

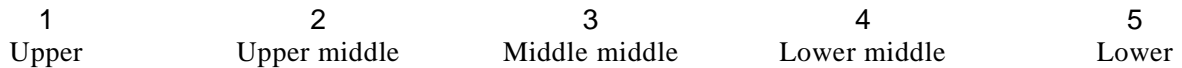
Q8 How would you rate your health condition?

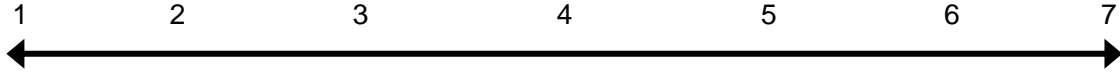

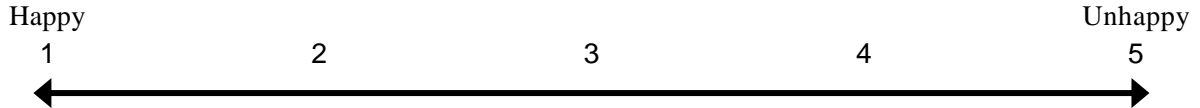

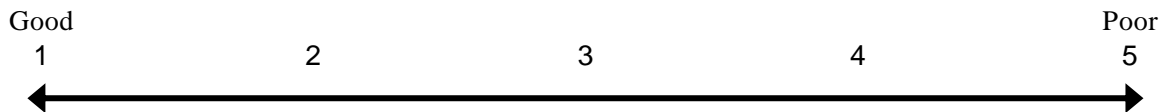
Q61 Would you say that your marriage is happy or unhappy?
